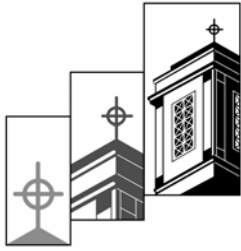

Investing Our Time and Sharing Our Talent in 2009

Most Holy Redeemer is a very special place. We are glad that you are with us today for Stewardship Sunday, whether you've been a parishioner for years, have just joined, or are simply here exploring the parish and what it has to offer.

Vibrant parishes, such as Most Holy Redeemer, are characterized by people both **investing their time** in spiritual pursuits (prayer, meditation, daily Mass, retreats, etc.) and also **sharing their talents** in ministries (lectoring, making coffee, serving on a committee, etc.). It is both our time and our talent which signifies our active involvement in the full life of the parish.

Here you will find a brief description of more than thirty different ministries, committees, programs, or events which would benefit from your involvement. Where the activity is not self-evident, we've included a short description. Some of these you may already be an active participant in while others may interest you as an avenue of new involvement in the parish. To learn more about any of these, we invite you to attend the **Ministry Fair on Sunday, February 1** after the 10:00 Mass in Ellard Hall.

Then, we invite you to prayerfully consider what level of involvement you can make with both your **time and talent** here at the parish. The inserted form will allow you to indicate where you are already active, and where you might like to become more active in the parish. During lent leaders of each activity will provide you with more information on any of the programs you select.

On the back of this form you will find basic demographic information as well as the opportunity to participate in the final phase of *Bridging the Gap*, the MHR capital campaign or to receive weekly envelopes for your regular tithes to financially support the parish. If you've never registered with the parish, please complete the entire form. If you're already registered, simply provide us your name, phone, email, and any updates.

As part of our offertory at each of the three weekend Masses on February 7 and 8 we will collect these forms as a communal sign of our commitment to one another and the parish as a whole. As the collection basket is being passed please place the time and talent form and place it in the basket. Please keep the listing of ministries for future reference.

Time . . . investing time in our relationship with God

All relationships require an investment of our time to be vital and fulfilling. While this is easy to see in our relationships with friends and family, it can be harder to remember this in our relationship with God. This year we invite all members of the MHR community to consider what more you can do to invest time in your relationship with God, beyond your weekly participation in Mass.

Here are some ways which are available to you. As a tangible sign of your commitment to these we invite you to complete the Time and Talent Survey and indicate which of these commitments you already do, or wish to begin. If it involves joining a group or registering, (like the Parish Retreat or a Small Faith Group) a leader will contact you to provide you more information. If it's simply a personal commitment on your part (like attending daily Mass regularly or spending time in personal prayer) we still invite you to indicate that on the form, as a sign of your personal commitment to spending this time with God.

Commitments with Others – (note this on the time/talent survey)

- Faith Sharing Groups – a way to build a small group connection with 6 to 8 other parishioners during Lent; see the next page for more details.
- Parish Retreat – March 6 to 8 in Menlo Park at Vallombrosa Center; this year's retreat "I Call You Friends" will focus on helping retreatants identify their personal strengths which they bring into their own ministry of friendship within and beyond the parish.
- Centering Prayer – weekly gathering to practice centering prayer on Monday evenings at 7:00 pm in the church

Individual Commitments – (personal commitments you may consider making)

- Rosary – a small group gathers between the two Sunday Masses to share the communal experience of the rosary
- Daily Mass – each morning at 8:00 am many from the parish begin their day together with daily celebration of the Eucharist
- The Little Black Book – the Young Adults Group is selling this simple guide to Lent which you can practice on your own as a devotion to prepare for Easter.
- The Little White Book – a companion book for daily devotions between Easter and Pentecost, also sold by the Young Adults Group
- Lenten Vesper Series – each Wednesday at 7:30 PM during Lent we will gather for a prayer service featuring a reflection offered by individuals in the parish

Time . . . investing time in our relationship with God

Small Faith Groups – Lent 2009

This year we're hoping to launch a number of small groups to meet weekly during Lent for faith sharing, prayer, and service. These groups will meet either at MHR or in the homes of different members. We are looking for both leaders and participants for this venture; our goal is to see if we can find 12 individuals (or couples) willing to lead small groups of 8 to 10 parishioners each.

Here is what Leaders Can Expect

- Guidance and support on how to facilitate a group
- Support in securing a location for the meeting, if you want it at MHR
- Weekly email exchange with other leaders on best practices

Here is what Leaders Will Do:

- Select a day and time for their meeting each week from (2/25 to 4/8)
- Secure a co-leader (or alternate) to assist them
- Determine a format – some groups simply use the coming Sunday's readings as their discussion point while others may choose to read a spiritual book together.
- Participate in a team leader training (one hour on a weekend or weeknight)
- Participate in a Small Group Launch on Sunday Feb. 22

Here is what Participants Can Expect:

- Matching with a group that meets their neighborhood/scheduling interest
- Weekly fellowship with other MHR Parishioners
- Opportunity to reflect more deeply on your faith during this time of year
