


Leader: God, (+)come to my assistance.

ALL: *(rise)* as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.





May this prayer, and the ones gathered in our hearts, come like incense before you.



Today, the Church celebrates the Memorial of St. Katharine Drexel, She founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, an order that built elementary and high schools for African American and Native American populations across the United States and established Xavier University in New Orleans, LA to train teachers for those schools. St. Katherine was from a prominent Philadelphia family, but her compassion for marginalized people led her to set aside her desire for contemplative life for five decades while she engaged in active Ministry.

"Often in my desire to work for others...


Some hostile influence renders me powerless.
