Fr. Matt's Message

"You are witnesses of these things"

Jesus's work is not complete even after he has risen from the dead. At the time of his dying and rising, his disciples had scattered, their faith crushed, and their spirits filled with despair. In Jesus's resurrection, he conquered death in his own being, but his greatest desire was not to keep this new life for himself but to share it with all. And so for forty days, until his ascension, he appeared to his disciples so they might also know the resurrection and their share in it. During this time, he prepares them for their mission to serve as witnesses until "all the nations" have encountered the gospel. In our Easter joy, we are reminded that this mission is now ours.

The Easter Season, next to Ordinary Time, is the longest liturgical season of the year. The Church reminds us to keep the celebration going, to keep savoring the joy of the resurrection. The readings from the Acts of the Apostles and our Gospel passages focus on the early days of the church and on the Risen Christ, present in their midst. In those early days, the newly baptized would continue to wear their white garments for a good period of time after baptism. At our Easter Vigil, Yasmeen, Samantha, and Sheldon were baptized and robed in white. They have since hung up their white baptismal garments, but continue to reflect, along with Marcella, Caroline, and Jared, who were confirmed and welcomed into the Church at the Vigil, on the many ways that God has blessed them.

We were all "robed in Christ" in Baptism. We change our garments every day but still remain focused on the Resurrection. The Easter Season is a good time to meditate on the ways that God has blessed us with new life and how we share and live that joy.

Easter Readings

At Sunday Mass the first reading usually comes from the Old Testament. This custom changes, however, during Easter Time. For seven weeks from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, the first readings all come from the same book: the Acts of the Apostles. Thus the three readings at Sunday Mass and the two readings at daily Mass all come from the New Testament throughout Easter Time.

Easter makes everything new. The resurrection so changes human history that we immerse ourselves in the New Testament to seek more deeply the meaning of this mystery.

The Acts of the Apostles tells of the beginnings of the church. It opens with the ascension and Pentecost, recounts the spread of the faith in peace and persecution, and concludes with the missionary activity of Paul. This book bridges the gospels with the rest of church history. The Gospels culminate in the resurrection of Jesus, which inspired evangelization. Each Easter our church announces the resurrection through the Scriptures and increases its membership through baptism. We witness evangelization today as we recall its origins in the Acts of the Apostles.

The Old Testament is not completely absent. The Liturgy of the Word throughout the season still includes a responsorial psalm. The Mass for the Pentecost Vigil includes one or more readings from the Old Testament, foreshadowing the gift of the Spirit.

When planning other liturgies for Easter Time—funerals, weddings, penance services, or baptisms, for example—the first readings for those celebrations best come from the New Testament. No matter the occasion, our Scripture readings set this season aside from all others, because it ranks above all others. Easter announces new life in Christ.

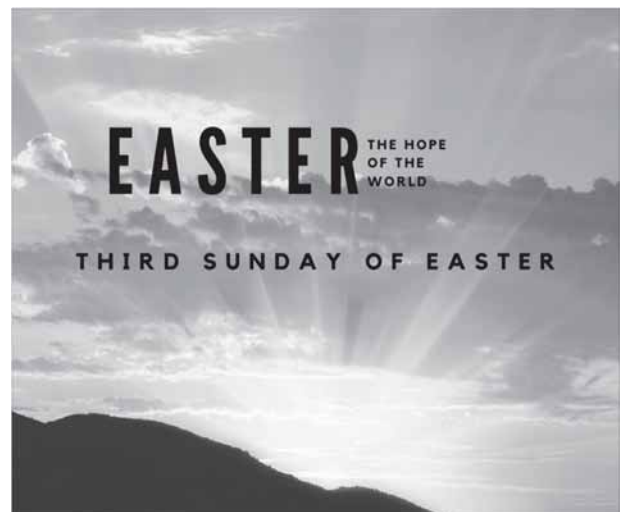
