Fr. Matt's Message

Most Holy Trinity - Be Love!

Isn't that the incarnation? Catholic doctrine is meant to be lived. We do all we can to live in love; to live love. The sacred mysteries that we celebrate don't exist to befuddle or confuse us and they are not mysteries that we necessarily try to solve. As a people made in the image and likeness of God, we know we were born into a holy and loving relationship. And in baptism, this loving relationship was solidified when we were presented, named, and claimed. And Jesus assures us, "Behold, I am with you until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). But sometimes life leaves us feeling isolated, lost and alone. Withdrawn and "closeted," closed up within ourselves, hiding those parts we are afraid to reveal to God, to another person, to our families, to the world.

Our own Parish Mission Statement speaks of this – of our parish striving to be a place which draws people "from isolation to community, from searching to awakening, from indifference to concern, from selfishness to meaningful service, from fear in the midst of adversity to faith and hope in God." It's a good statement. We do well to own it and to try to live it.

But it takes some effort and some risk on our part. Coming out of hiding and revealing who we truly are can be pretty scary business. What if we reveal our true self and people are disappointed or simply don't like or accept us? It could happen. We hope it wouldn't happen here. But let's don't sugar coat it. We know it has.

This knowing actually does reveal to us where we need to do our work. As we look within, we might find out some of the darkness that is there. Pope Francis, Archbishop Cordileone, and so many of our bishops, cardinals, priests and preachers, our civic leaders and friends, have spoken out against the evil of racism. We join our voices with theirs and do all we can to not let this be a passing moment. That we truly are a part of the change that we want to see. And not just for the month of May when we celebrate Asian American and Pacific Islanders month, or the Summer of 2021, the hoped-for end of a season and a time we will never forget. But for all of our remaining seasons and times.

That's the kind of hope that we let "spring eternal." And in the end, aren't we people of hope? "And hope cannot remain silent," (Harvey Milk) and "hope does not disappoint," (St. Paul), because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

God, who loves us so much, gave what he loved the absolute most, (JN 3:16) wants us to mirror that life of the blessed Trinity with lives open to creative dialogue, redemptive sharing, and spirit-filled inspiration, with our eyes and hearts always open and ready to share that spirit of God's inclusive love.

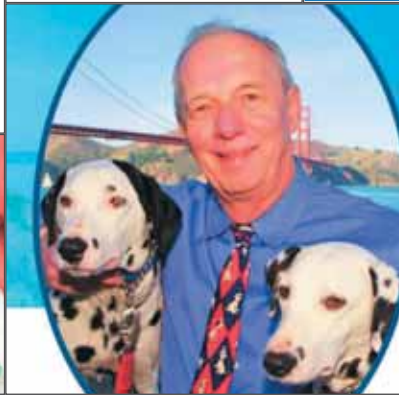
