and you, my brothers and sisters,


to pray for me to the Lord our God.



Assembly: We lift them up to the Lord.


Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

# Lord's Prayer

as we forgive those who trespass against us;

and lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

Presider: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days,

that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress,

as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Assembly: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever.


Presider: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world.
